

When Evacuating.....

When evacuating, you should bring a **go bag with important documents, supplies, and a change of clothes.**

Documents [1]

- Driver's license, passport, and other forms of identification
- Birth certificates, social security cards, and other legal documents
- Insurance policies and other financial records (most of this is kept digitally so maybe not necessary)

Supplies [2, 3, 6]

- A 3-day supply of non-perishable food and 3 gallons of water per person
- A first aid kit and sanitation supplies
- A flashlight and battery-powered radio with extra batteries
- Extra car keys, credit cards, cash, or traveler's checks
- A change of clothes and extra eyeglasses/contact lenses

Other items [1, 2, 7]

- Medications, prescriptions, and vitamins
- Pet food and water
- Copies of important documents
- Cell phone and charger
- Cash in case power is out

Plan ahead [4, 5]

- Plan your route and leave early [4, 5]
- Listen to local media and follow instructions from public safety officials [5, 8]
- Plan where your family will meet and go [5]
- Act early if you are older or have children, disabilities or limited access to transportation [9]
